1. Presentation of the DaWetRest Project

The DaWetRest (Danube Wetlands and Flood Plains Restoration) project aims to develop and demonstrate, on the Danube River Basin, concrete solutions to address the challenges faced within inland and coastal wetland ecosystems, in four key areas: biodiversity, water quality, climate resilience, and socio-economic benefits for local communities.

2. Concept of the Community of Practice

A Community of Practice is a platform to facilitate collaboration and exchange between people from different backgrounds that pursue the same goals. The DaWetRest project envisions the Community of Practice becoming a continuous platform facilitating wetland restoration in the Danube River Basin that benefits the local communities socially, economically and environmentally.

3. WaterLANDs Project

The WaterLANDs Project will contribute to the restoration of wetland sites across Europe which have been damaged by human activity and is laying the foundations for protection across larger areas. The Dragoman Marsh Action Site is a place of encounter, creativity, and collaboration - home to engagement activities and Artists-in-Residence.
