Insights from the Session: DaWetRest Associated Regions and their Challenges

Andalusia, Spain - Maria Soledad Vivas Navarro

Challenges for this region are coastal dynamics and hydrological alteration, pollution as well as marine litter.

Srbac, Republic of Srpska, Bosnia and Herzegovina - Dragana Šnjegota

This region faces challenges such as climate change, agricultural expansion and changes in land use and land ownership.

Municipality of Poti, Georgia - Tamar Sardalishvili

One technical challenge the region faces is designing and implementing advanced technologies like floating barriers and monitoring systems.

Municipality of Samandağ, Turkey - Sergen Doğru

Two challenges the region is facing are Post-Earthquake Recovery and Invasive Species Regrowth.

Municipality of Danilovgrad, Montenegro - Glorija Šćepanović

A challenge of this region is biodiversity loss.

Municipality of Modriča, Bosnia and Herzegovina - Nataša Mazalica

Key challenges of the region are agricultural expansion as well as poor landscape planning and low environmental awareness.
